### BARANGAROO ART COMPETITION SPARKS STUDENTS' CREATIVITY

Barangaroo's Indigenous links and the waterside precinct's celebration of Sydney Harbour are recurring themes in a "See Your Artwork" competition in which all entries from school students are being featured on a 60 metre long stretch of display panels at the CBD construction site.

A joint initiative of the Barangaroo Delivery Authority and Lend Lease, the art competition offered students the opportunity to win prizes and have their creative works placed on show to the public.

School students across Sydney were asked to tell their story of Barangaroo by drawing, painting or creating: "What Barangaroo means to you."

Announcing the results today, Barangaroo Delivery Authority Chief Executive Officer John Tabart said the judging panel was impressed by the high quality of the entries, the artists' inventiveness and the fact students appreciated the benefits of Barangaroo.

"In both honouring the past and visualising the future, the competitors have superbly showcased what Barangaroo means to them and to Sydney," Mr Tabart said.

Lend Lease's Barangaroo South Managing Director Andrew Wilson said it was impressive to see the imaginative approach taken by students from more than 35 suburbs: "Through paint, crayons, pastels and collage, these students have captured the excitement of Barangaroo."

At a VIP event on the Barangaroo foreshore today, the winners and runners-up unveiled the spectacular artwork display.

Students could enter as individuals or as part of a group. There were more than 180 entries in three age categories. Category winners received an iPad, with three runners-up in each category being awarded \$150 shopping vouchers. The judging panel was comprised of representatives of the Barangaroo Delivery Authority and Lend Lease.
